#### The Epistle: 1 John 4:7-21

7Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. 8He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. 9In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. <sup>10</sup>Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. <sup>11</sup>Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another. <sup>12</sup>No man hath seen God at any time. # The Ministration of Holy Baptism

#### **Presentation and Examination of the Candidates**

The Priest says

The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Parents and Godparents

I present *N*. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When all have been presented the Priest asks the Parents and Godparents

Will ye take heed that this child whom thou dost present be brought up in the Christian faith and life, that *he* learns the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments, and all other things which a Christian ought to know and believe to his soul's health?

Answer I will, by God's help.

*Priest* Wilt thou by thy prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of

Christ, and wilt thou take heed that this child, so soon as sufficiently instructed, be

brought to the Bishop to be confirmed by him?

Answer I will, God being my helper.

Then the Priests asks the following questions of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infant and younger child

Question Dost thou, in the name of this Child, renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of

wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Dost thou renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the

creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Dost thou renounce all sinful desires that draw thee from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Dost thou turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as thy Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Dost thou put thy whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Question Dost thou promise to follow and obey him as thy Lord and Master?

Answer I do.

All stand.

The Priest addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

People We will.

#### The Priest then says

Dearly beloved, inasmuch as we who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were buried with him in his death, so that we might be made partakers of his resurrection and walk in newness of life, let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew, on our own part, the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism.

Priest Wilt thou proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ Jesus?

People I will, with God's help.

*Priest* Wilt thou seek and serve Christ in all men, loving thy neighbor as thyself?

People I will, with God's help.

Priest Wilt thou strive for justice and peace among all men, and respect the dignity of

every human being?

People I will, with God's help.

#### **Prayers for the Candidates**

All kneel. As the Minister leads the following petitions, the baptismal party processes to the font.

*Minister* Send them into the world in witness to thy love.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister Bring them to the fullness thy peace and glory.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

#### The Priest says

Grant, O Lord, we beseech thee, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ thy Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who livest and reignest now and forever. *Amen*.

## Thanksgiving over the Water

*The font is filled with water.* 

All stand. The Priest blesses the water, first saying

The Lord be with you.

People And with thy spirit.

Priest Lift up your hearts.

*People* We lift them up unto the Lord.

*Priest* Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

*People* It is meet and right so to do.

#### The Priest continues

We give thee thanks, Almighty God, for the gift of water, over which thy Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation; through which thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise; in which thy Son Jesus Christ received the baptism of John and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, being manifested thereby as the Messiah, the Christ, who leadeth us, through his precious death and mighty resurrection, from the bondage of sin unto life everlasting.

We give thee thanks, O Father, for the water of Baptism, in which we are buried with Christ in his death; by which we partake of his resurrection; through which we are made regenerate of the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship them that come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Now sanctify this water, we beseech thee, by the power of the Holy Ghost, that those here cleansed from sin and made regenerate may continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior, to whom, with thee and the same Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, now and forever. *Amen*.

#### The Baptism

Each candidate is presented by name to the Priest, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying

N., I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with Chrism, and saying to each one

N., thou art sealed by the Holy Ghost in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

#### The Priest continues

We receive this Child into the congregation of Christ's flock; and do sign him with the sign of the Cross, in token that hereafter he shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and manfully to fight under his banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto his life's end. *Amen*.

A candle lit from the Paschal Candle is given to the newly baptized.

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, maker of all things, judge of all men: We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, which we from time to time most grievously have committed, by thought, word, and deed, against thy divine Majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us, the burden of them is intolerable. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honor and glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### The Priest alone stands and says

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who of his great mercy hath promised forgiveness of sins to all those who with hearty repentance and true faith turn unto him; Have mercy upon you; pardon and deliver you from all your sins; confirm and strengthen you in all goodness; and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

#### Then the Priest saus

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all who truly turn to him.

Come unto me, all ye that travail and are heavy laden, and I will refresh you. *Matthew 11:28* So God loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten Son, to the end that all that believe in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. *John 3:16*



All glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.


